Let's have a good roll up for what will be a very interesting night.



Dear Rotarians,

I have just received the following email from Michael Jacobs, Trustee of the Cozens Trust, who has been given this incredible information to pass on to the seven District 9810 Clubs involved in supporting the Purnululu Bus Grant with the Cozens Trust.

A fantastic result from your respective clubs joining together to assist young students, and their families, in need of a bus to get to school so they can be educated and there is more, so read on.....

"I spoke today to the new Principal at Purnululu School - Corrie Baxter" and you will be pleased to know that the Bus provided by the Cozens Trust and the Rotary Clubs from D9810 has had a very positive effect on the enrolments at the School. See below email. Corrie tells me that all but 2 of the Students who had left the School as a result of no local housing being available to their families have returned to the School as a result of the bus being available to take them to School. 10 students now travel 60km each way on the bus each day to attend Purnululu (others

travel a shorter distance on the Bus). The Principal as a result provides breakfast to the 10 students.

Corrie also told me today that she has been successful in getting a Government Grant to repair some of the dilapidated housing in the associated School Community and hopes that a few of the displaced families may eventually be able to return to living in the local community (Frog Hollow).


If this happens the School will have the possibility of collecting other Students in the Bus and further increasing their enrolment. However ignoring this possibility a very satisfactory result has already been achieved through the donation of the Bus".
