

VOCATIONAL SERVICES: The Butterfly Project – Vic Pol Mentoring

On Monday, 7th August, Geoff Logie Smith, Terry Roche, Rhonda and Phillip McKenzie and I attended the launch of the Butterfly Project at Fawkner police station at 11am. This is the bicycle recycling project devised and developed by Senior Sergeant Yvonne Upton as her community involvement project for the Vic Pol Leadership mentoring program.

This is an inclusive program which started with Yvonne and I. Then we sought the assistance of the RC of Pascoe Vale, who jumped on board with great enthusiasm and financial backing. Through their contacts at the Cariya Society, where people with disabilities are taught life and work skills, one of which is bicycle repairs, we found people who could refurbish the bikes. The RC of Pascoe Vale also have community contacts to identify disadvantaged people who would benefit from having a bike. Thus our first recipient was identified - Victoria, a year six student. Her four siblings will also receive bikes soon. Her parents also attended the launch. She was told that she had to leave school for a dental check and then was brought to the police station. She was wondering why she was having a dental check at the police station, but soon found out the real reason. You couldn't wipe the smile off her face.

The launch was attended by senior representatives of Vic Pol, RC of Pascoe Vale, the mayor of Moreland, (I gotta say we have milk in the fridge older than her, but it's great to see a young person interested in politics) her parents and us. Channel 9 News filmed it as well as interviews with the recipient, her parents, the guys from Carinya Society who worked on the bike and Yvonne. It aired as a human interest story on the 6pm news on Saturday, 12 August. Vic Pol has about 30,000 bikes go through them each year. Less than 10% get back to their owners. The next step is to expand the program to the other seven police stations in the region where Yvonne works. Eventually we would like to get every Victorian police station involved. This could be a project for our club to get off the ground with Glen Waverley police station. There are also many bikes which cannot be properly restored in an economical manner. Yvonne has been in contact with Bikes for Humanity (another Rotary project), who send bikes overseas (primarily to Africa) to help poor communities. Any bikes which are too expensive to repair will go there. So now it's becoming an international project as well.
