Youth Services Report

This (Saturday) morning, I attended the section of the Waverley Music Eisteddfod that we sponsor, **the 18 years and under String Solo section**. The Eisteddfod is conducted over seven days.

I presented prizes to the following placegetters.

First prize Dion Quach Violin. Tie for second, therefore two prizes - Elizabeth Baker and Charlotte Miles - Both Viola.

These entrants were, as usual, of a very high standard, and as I remarked in my usual address, will ultimately end up in careers as professional musicians. The talent is such that one of the second placegetters was only 11 years old! Far too good for the under 16 and under 14 sections.

As usual I was asked to offer some observations with a vocational theme for their guidance and this year I was able to share with them some experience and guidance on managing stage performance nerves, and converting it to positive energy. This project is probably more vocational than youth services, but in any event, our sponsorship and attendance is well appreciated.

Last Tuesday I met with Simon Bartlett, Community Partnerships Manager, Mount Waverley Secondary College. It was an excellent meeting. He was very keen to make contact with Rotary to see if a relationship could be established to cover various leadership project ideas they have. There was an understanding that we appreciate two way relationships with schools.

It was a two and a half hour meeting where I met various teachers and the Principal, as well as about twenty students representing the Student's Representative Council.

I had previously forwarded a copy of the Rotary Booklet on Youth Services Programmes (Still New Generations according to the District website) and this booklet had already been copied to staff and selected students, which was encouraging.

Summary of Meeting.

1. Application Forms for 4 way speech test (closed Friday 15th) requested and forwarded. (Three applications received)
2. Very Interested in RYPEN (closing end August) and MUNA
3. They are lined up to make a presentation to us re the defibrillators, partnering with Bendigo Bank Pinewood. Scheduled for 27th.
4. Importantly they, in response to my question, outlined what the parents are doing to fundraise. They are focussed on school infrastructure needs, which are fairly major apparently.
5. One of their star pupils requires assistance with funding for a trip to The Netherlands as Australian Rep for a Youth UN project (similar to MUNA). Scheduled to speak to us on 27th to put his case.
6. They have offered space in their newsletter for any of our "public projects" eg The Mt Waverley market.
7. They are lined up to provide buskers for our next market (without the complications of teacher involvement experienced with another school we deal with).
8. Head of Senior Campus, Gail Major, is married to a Rotarian and is familiar with Rotary programmes.
