



VOCATIONAL - Update of Vic Pol Mentoring Program.

Since returning from her holiday, Senior Sargent Yvonne Upton has been very busy with her work and on her community project. We are still working on a catchy name for it and if anyone can think of something we are happy to consider suggestions.

Monty from the Rotary Club of Pascoe Vale has enlisted the help the help of the Carinya Society in Coburg. They are a training organisation, similar to Waverly Industries in some ways, who help people with mental and physical disabilities with life skills and work skills. They are refurbishing five bicycles which will be the first batch to be given to people in need. Bicycles which are too damaged for a simple refurbishment will be donated to another Rotary project, "Bikes for Humanity", which sends them to Africa for people in need. The Rotary Club of Pascoe Vale sponsor five "in need" children in Pascoe Vale South primary school by buying them books, uniforms, etc. They will be the first recipients of the recycled bikes.

This looks like being done at a launch in the first or second week after the school holidays (about 4 weeks). They will also be given bicycle helmets purchased by the Rotary Club of Pascoe Vale. Once a date is set I shall notify club members. We are trying to also make this a media event and Yvonne is in touch with the Vic Pol media unit.

We are hoping to attract daily newspapers, local newspapers and TV. We will also film it and edit it for Youtube and Facebook. It would be great if some Mt. Waverley club members could make the launch.
