

Presidents Report for 9 August 2017.

Our first meeting and dinner at Waverley Industries was a great success and well attended by our members; can I say a big thank you to Fiona for all her hard work in organising numbers and the dinner menu.

Our guest speaker this week was Hayley Dureau from Mount Waverley Secondary College (MWSC). In Hayley's presentation she gave us positive feedback from students who had attended some of our Rotary Youth Programmes and in particular RYLA and RYPEN. Hayley also thanked our Club for the opportunities our Youth Programmes provide students in developing their leadership skills and we look forward to a long association with MWSC in continuing our Youth Programmes. As an aside

Rhonda McKenzie will look into the possibility of formalising a corporate membership for MWSC, of our club. This will allow their College staff to attend our meetings and see just what we, as Rotarians, do in our local community.

I had the pleasure of attending my first District Presidents' meeting last Friday night. 


Re: District Foundation Centurion Program 2017/18

In my role as District Centurion Coordinator, I wish to report that I've recently completed the reconciliation of the District Centurion Club records with those of the Australian Rotary Foundation Trust for year 2016/17. As a result, I can confirm that with the assistance of your Club last year '2016/17', personal giving through the Centurion Club Program achieved a high of \$55,923 from 465 generous Centurion Donors in our District.

Congratulations to everyone for making this happen, a great effort and Thank you! The Foundation Committee would be very pleased if you could announce this result together with our sincere appreciation at your next weekly Club Meeting. Everyone involved should feel very proud.

As you know in my role as Coordinator, I rely heavily on the support of the Club Foundation Chairperson to generate Club member interest in the Centurion program and to assist me maintain current contributor records. This is an ongoing process and again during 2017-18 I seek your assistance.

In order to do good around the world more often, our Goal in 2017/18 must be 'To encourage more Rotarians to join the Centurion Program' which then not only assists the Foundation Globally but helps make available more District funds to our District Clubs in 3 yrs time. Therefore, I would be very grateful if you would make this one of your 2017/18 Club Foundation Goals. After all, it may be your effort that will 'Make The Difference'.

For your use, I've included a report which shows your Club performance in the Centurion program and lists member participation during the last year. If you would please check the listing and advise me of any changes required to member's details (especially email address) or members who are no longer in your Club, I would be very appreciative. I will be using these details to contact members when a renewal falls due so it's important I have the latest data.

As a way of assisting your Club to increase the participation rate, I note that some Clubs enjoy great success through encouraging their members to donate on a weekly basis. This is where the Club sanctions the idea of members (who wish to participate) contributing say \$2/wk towards the 'annual \$100 Centurion membership (either by adding it to their weekly meal fee or collected separately). The money is collected and collated by the Treasurer until the member donation reaches \$100 and then it is remitted with others on a common date (say Foundation month or May) each year. I hope that you may find this idea of some value in your Club service.

Finally, I've included an electronic copy of the 'Centurion Membership Form' for your use this year.

Hard copies of the Centurion Brochures will be available for collection during the District Foundation Seminar on 11th August 2017.

Please thank all of your members who have participated last year and I look forward to working with you during 2017/18 to raise the bar yet again.
