Although a cold Winter's night, there was an excellent attendance when one considers that a significant proportion of absences were for members either interstate or overseas. The meeting was graced with the presence of Michael Best of Carmic Trailers Pty Ltd together with his wife Caroline and their children, Brad and Katie. The Club is indebted to Michael for his terrific work in keeping the Sunday Market trailer in A1 condition both from a roadworthiness perspective and as a professional representation of the Club to the public. Les Walker, the President of the Rotary Club of Glen Waverley (RCGW) additionally attended and was afforded the opportunity to update members on international projects his club was associated with, notably in Thailand and Myanmar. Through Geoff Taylor we are looking forward to entering discussions for any potential collaboration with the RCGW sometime this Rotary Year, albeit a bite size international project or something more substantial.

The guest speaker for the night was Brad Potter from the Salvation Army of Waverley. Through his presentation we were reminded how close to home poverty and hardship exists in the face of the City of Monash being an outwardly affluent suburb. This was exemplified with his insight that approximately thirty percent of school children in Monash attend each school day hungry. Whilst it is accepted that a proportion of children willingly choose to not eat a breakfast, there is nevertheless a disturbingly large number of children that do not have that choice. Hence, the Club has been afforded the opportunity to be a sponsor (primarily for the food component) of the Salvation Army Breakfast Program conducted at the Brentwood Primary School. Glen Watkins has already made an indication that he will find room within his Community Budget to support, and possibly so in collaboration with another Rotary club.

There is much coming up in the month of August. Next week (29 Jul 15) we have a Board meeting concurrently with a visit of the AG, Tom Blair. Tom's visit is a prelude to the visit of the DG the following week (5 Aug 15), from David Tolstrup and his wife, Alison. This is a big night in our Rotary Year, and undoubtedly our most important visit. Accordingly this will be a partners' night and I encourage of all you to come as a couple.

Next Friday (31 Jul 15) I will be attending the District Membership Seminar. With Ros Clowes away (the Club's Membership Officer), if there any late takers who are available to attend with me, please advise ASAP. Similarly, if there any members interested in attending with me an induction evening at the Ashwood Secondary College Interact Club on Tue 4 Aug 15, please also advise ASAP. As you aware I am really keen to have an Interact Club established this Rotary Year and will work closely with Geoff Logie-Smith post his return from leave to make this occur.
