Presidents Report Sept 25

Delivered again by IPP Ros...._Another Last Ros Report

As promised last week, our own **Gordon Oliver** did give us a fascinating insight into his current role in Alice Springs. Working with Geo Science Australia on Data Acquisition, via the Satellite Tracking Low Earth Orbit, Gordon's responsibility 'revolves' around the 5 metre dish recording data from the satellite which is only 750m above the earth and which only gives them a 15 minute range between rise and set. This is a LANDSAT Data Continuity Mission and the satellite covers the complete earth's surface

every 16 days. (I don't promise to have captured this accurately, but most interesting, nevertheless - thank you Gordon - pity so many members were away last week - they missed a good presentation). Last Monday **Paul Power** and I attended the MWCIS (Monash Waverley Community Information and Services) AGM. Outgoing **President Barbara Trifle** was commended for her excellent work and their **new President is Chris Brassington**. Our congratulations to Chris - we look forward to an ongoing relationship with MWCIS. Their Annual Report and the President's Report gave thanks and many mentions of our Club. All our help is gratefully received and invaluable.

FUNDRAISING

1. Proposed "Garage Sale" Project.

The Rotary Club of Mount Waverley in partnership with the Rotary Club of Oakleigh will conduct a Garage Sale of upmarket, new & second hand goods on Sunday the 27th October at the Oakleigh Market from 8 am to 2 pm.

To this effect, it would be appreciated if you could source any of the items listed below from your own households, that of relatives, friends & neighbours now and over the next 8 weeks. Many of the items left out for the annual council collections are suitable, although we are not conducting a rubbish collection.

In an endeavour to limit left over rubbish and hence the disposal problem of same, it is requested that articles be clean and in working order, preferably less than 5 years old and certainly not more than 10 years old. Until the sale date, goods may be delivered either to Adrian or to Terry Roche or they can be collected. The goods will be stored at the Club's storage facility. The funds raised will be split between the two clubs and used for community projects.

Type of goods required.

This is a suggested list, but suitability should be confirmed with either Terry or Adrian. Suffice to say, size of item(s) is important. If it won't fit into a car boot it is unsuitable.

- Electrical appliances in safe working order. These will be tested before sale.
- New clothes in original packaging.
- Clean blankets in good condition.
- Small articles of furniture no larger than a chair.
- Kitchen appliances in good condition. Includes cooking utensils pots & pans.
- Dinner sets and cutlery.
- Office equipment and entertainment goods less than 5 years old.
- Fashionable jewellery, watches and clocks.
- Hard cover books, but not school books or textbooks. Car manuals and similar books.
- Objects de arte such as framed photos and prints, statues, pottery and Bric-a-Brac, subject to inspection and suitability. In other words if you would buy it others will to!
- Garden implements and garage items such as tools etc.
- Sporting goods such as cricket sets and tennis racquets. Balls of all sizes in good condition.
- Labelled tinned food, but no putrescibles.
- Anything else with a good chance of sale able to be fitted into a car boot.

Any donations you can make to this fund raising endeavour will be gratefully accepted.
